UNIVERSITY HIGH SCHOOL ACADEMY

University High School Academy (UHSA) opened its doors to ninth grade students on September 2, 2008 with the graduating class of 2012. In order to attend the University High School Academy, students take the High School Placement Test (HSPT). Additionally, students complete an application packet which includes middle school grades, a personal statement and a letter of interest from the parent(s). Students must maintain a 3.0 GPA or adequate progress towards a 3.0 GPA to remain at the school. The student population is comprised of 96% African American, 2% Asian/Pacific Islander, 1% Caucasian, and 1% Hispanic.
